BEC PA Code 4.26 Overview

State regulation, 22 Pa. Code § 4.26, declares:

Every school district shall provide a program for each student whose dominant language is not English for the purpose of facilitating the student's achievement of English proficiency and the academic standards under § 4.12 (relating to academic standards). Programs under this section shall include appropriate bilingual-bicultural or English as a second language (ESL) instruction.

As used here, the term "program" refers to: (1) planned instruction by a qualified ESL/Bilingual teacher, (2) adaptations/modifications in the delivery of content instruction by all teachers based on the student's language proficiency level and the Pennsylvania Language Proficiency Standards (PA ELPS) for ELLs as well as the Pennsylvania academic standards.



BEC PA Code 4.26 Instructional Models

The Program model(s) that the LEA adopts for ELLs must be:

- 1) based on an educational theory recognized as sound by some experts in the field or considered by experts as a legitimate experimental strategy;
- 2) reasonably calculated, including provisions for resources and personnel, to implement the theory effectively; and
- 3) evaluated and adjusted where needed to ensure language barriers are actually being overcome.

What is the WIDA ACCESS for ELLs?

- The WIDA ACCESS for ELLs is the annual English Language Proficiency Assessment given to ALL English Language Learners (ELLs) in Pennsylvania public LEAs annually.
- It measures proficiency in Listening, Speaking, Reading, Writing, Comprehension, Literacy and Oral Language in both social and academic English.

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Why are WIDA ACCESS Scores important?

- They provide information about language proficiency which can be used to inform appropriate planned instruction for ELLs in the ESL/bilingual program and in other content area classes.
- Knowing the WIDA ACCESS level helps educators set fair expectations for ELLs in terms of tasks and performance.



Why are WIDA ACCESS Scores important?

- WIDA ACCESS scores can show ELL progress over time. This is useful in: program evaluation, data team meetings, and informing placement decisions for ELLs in various academic programs and services.
- WIDA ACCESS Data should be accessible to school leaders, program administrators, psychologists, IEP Teams, Parents, ESL teachers and content teachers, as well as other educators that make important educational decisions

What is eMetric ACCESS for ELLs Data Interaction Tool?

A data tool that can be used by LEAs:

- to analyze WIDA ACCESS scores
- to view reports in graphic, numerical, and excel spreadsheet format
- that is provided free of charge to LEAs
- that requires a login



How can eMetric ACCESS for ELLs Data Interaction Tool be used?

- Can compare data over multiple years, multiple schools, subject areas
- Can look at subgroup data (IEP, race, gender, etc.)
- Can find strengths and weaknesses by language domain (LSRW)
- Can "drill to roster" to find the names of students in different categories



Proficiency Level Interpretation

At the given level of English language proficiency, English language learners process, understand, produce, or use:

6 - Reaching

- specialized or technical language reflective of the content area at grade level
- a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in extended oral or written discourse as required by the specified grade level
- oral or written communication in English comparable to proficient English peers

5 - Bridging

- · the technical language of the content areas
- a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in extended oral or written discourse, including stories, essays, or reports.
- oral or written language approaching comparability to that of English proficient peers when presented with grade level material.

4 - Expanding

- specific and some technical language of the content areas.
- a variety of sentence lengths of varying linguistic complexity in oral discourse or multiple, related sentences or paragraphs.
- oral or written language with minimal phonological, syntactic, or semantic errors that do not impede the overall meaning of the communication when
 presented with oral or written connected discourse with visual, graphic, or interactive support.


- · general and some specific language of the content areas.
- expanded sentences in oral interaction or written paragraphs.
- oral or written language with phonological, syntactic, or semantic errors that may impede the communication, but retain much of its meaning, when
 presented with oral or written, narrative or expository descriptions with visual, graphic, or interactive support.


